Caring for an injured, sick or abandoned animal is a powerful experience no matter where you are, but in a rehabilitation sanctuary, surrounded by some of Africa's most iconic wildlife, including 3 of the Big 5 species (Lion, Leopard, Rhino), it can be a truly life-changing experience. This unique experience allows you to get up close and personal with the carnivores at the rehabilitation centre daily while learning the importance of conservation in the 21st century.

## Conservation Spotlight

#### pe-releasing animals into the wild

It's disheartening that human actions often lead to the injury or orphaning of wildlife, especially in regions like South Africa where the diversity of wildlife is significant. Wildlife rehabilitation centres play a crucial role in providing a safe haven for these animals. They offer specialized care, medical attention, and rehabilitation programs aimed at restoring the health and natural behaviours of the animals.

#### pe-releasing animals into the wild

While conservationists would love all rehabilitated animals to be released back into the wild, sadly the instances where this is possible are the exception rather than the rule. Even when an animal has recovered to full health, releasing it back into the wild isn't always possible. As a consequence, many animals that are taken in at the rehabilitation centre go on to become permanent residents. So the work of a volunteer together with a wildlife rehabilitation centre, after they have helped an animal regain full health, is to provide a rich and fulfilling life for their residents.

### The far-reaching impacts of wildlife rehabilitation facilities

As an animal care volunteer, you can have a very immediate and obvious impact on the well-being of an individual animal. But the effects thereof stretch far beyond the fences of our centre. Some species such as the serval (a wild cat that resembles a leopard) are now bred in rehabilitation centres in South Africa and then released into the wild. This strategy doesn't work for all species – lions and hyenas are both notoriously difficult to release back into the wild – but for species like the serval, it's an effective way to repopulate areas where they had previously been wiped out.

This is exactly why we partnered with Ubhetyan-O-Africa who have an exceptionally high success rate for the re-release of certain species, including small carnivores, reptiles, antelope, and many birds.

Ubhetyan means "Rhino" in Zulu, with the reserve located in a malaria-free area of Mpumalanga.

A Family owned and operated since 2010, Ubhetyan-O-Africa is administered to the highest ethical standards, in keeping with modern conservation methods for the protection and enhancement of its indigenous and endangered species.

This private game reserve situated 40km outside Middelburg (MP) is nestled in the enchanting landscapes of Mpumalanga, with a full-time chef, restaurant, functions and catering facilities available. At night the sound of lions roaring, the whoop of hyenas, and waking up to the call of the Southern ground hornbill (to name a few) will all add to an unforgettable experience.

Spread over 502 hectares of untamed bushveld. Situated 145 km from Pretoria & 155 km from Johannesburg International Airport.

During the Summer months (September to Feb) temperatures can rise to 40 degrees Celsius (104 Fahrenheit) This is also our rainy season so expect thundershowers/overcast days.

During Winter months (May to August) daily temperatures are around 25 degrees Celsius (77 Fahrenheit) with night temperatures plummeting to zero degrees Celsius (32 Fahrenheit)

The breeding program ensures gene diversity by breeding strong bloodlines, with the carnivore breeding programs involving Hyena, Leopard, Wild dog, Black Footed Cat, Fenner Fox, Bat-eared Fox & Honey Badger.

Ubhetyan-O-Africa is also involved with LALP (Loskop Area Leopard Project) when the need arises, volunteers will assist in trapping problem animals to relocate.

Rhinos are free-roaming and part of your volunteer responsibilities is monitoring the safekeeping of these animals day and night.

Both support the "Anti-Rhino poaching" program and sometimes you will be involved in site visits where poaching took place.
